

Fertilizer Inspection Readiness

Agri-Inputs & Farm Supply

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This guide explains what the tool produces, how to use the output, and what to watch for. The actual output (draft/report) is generated on the tool page.

Background

Produces an inspection-readiness checklist for a fertilizer dealer — licence/source docs, stock-PoS matching, MRP/display compliance, records and quality/sampling response. Use it to be ready for agriculture-department inspection. For general licence renewal use the Licence Renewal Tracker.

Purpose of this tool & output

Pass FCO and DBT inspections

How the output is used

Use it to be ready for an FCO or DBT inspection — the licence, stock, PoS/iFMS and record checklist an inspector will run through, prepared in advance.

Who receives it

The inspection is conducted by the Fertilizer Inspector / notified officer of the State Agriculture Department under the FCO and the DBT scheme.

How to submit / file it

Keep the FCO licence, source and Form-O certificates, stock register, PoS/iFMS records and price display ready at the shop; produce them when the inspector visits and address any observation in writing.

Fees & charges

No fee for the inspection itself; non-compliance can attract penalties, stock seizure or licence action under the FCO.

Who should vet it

A local FCO/agri-licensing consultant, to run a mock check of your records and storage before the actual inspection.

Important cautions

Inspections focus on licence/source validity, stock-PoS match, MRP compliance and display/records. Keep genuine sources so a manufacturing quality defect is the company liability, not yours. Cooperate professionally. Confirm current FCO inspection norms with the department.
