

Maintenance & Airworthiness Tracking Guide

Background

Helps set up maintenance and airworthiness tracking — schedules, ADs and SBs, components and life-limits, and status visibility — to keep aircraft airworthy and avoid grounding. Use it to run maintenance tracking.

Purpose of this tool & output

Track maintenance and airworthiness status

How the output is used

Use it to track maintenance and airworthiness status — due lists, life-limited parts and directives so no aircraft flies out of compliance.

Important cautions

Overflying a maintenance or life limit grounds the aircraft and breaches airworthiness law; tracking must be accurate and current. Confirm the programme and limits with your CAMO and CAR requirements and never overfly a limit.
