

Pollution Consent (CTE/CTO) Guide

Chemicals & Process Industry

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This guide explains what the tool produces, how to use the output, and what to watch for. The actual output (draft/report) is generated on the tool page.

Background

Get a guide to obtaining pollution-board consent for a chemical unit — category (red/orange), Consent to Establish and Operate, effluent/emission/hazardous-waste requirements, and the application route. Describe the unit below.

Purpose of this tool & output

Get SPCB consent for a chemical unit

How the output is used

Use it to get State Pollution Control Board consent (CTE then CTO) for a chemical unit — what to prepare so the category and treatment satisfy the Board.

Who receives it

The State Pollution Control Board (Consent to Establish / Consent to Operate).

How to submit / file it

Apply on the state PCB portal with the project, effluent/emission and treatment details; category (red/orange/green) decides scrutiny.

Fees & charges

A fee based on category and project cost; validity and renewal vary by state and category.

Who should vet it

An environmental consultant for category, norms and treatment design.

Important cautions

AI-generated guide; chemical units are usually Red category with stringent conditions - confirm with the SPCB.
