Who receives it

The State/City Fire Services Department.

How to submit / file it

Apply with the fire-fighting layout and installed systems; a provisional NOC precedes and a final NOC follows inspection.

Fees & charges

Fees vary by building height, area and occupancy per state fire rules.

Who should vet it

A licensed fire-safety consultant, for the fire scheme and compliant installations.

Important cautions
