

Inspection Readiness Checklist

Diagnostics, Labs & Imaging

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This guide explains what the tool produces, how to use the output, and what to watch for. The actual output (draft/report) is generated on the tool page.

Background

Builds an inspection-readiness checklist across all authorities — health, AERB, PC-PNDT, pollution board, GST and labour — covering documents, displays, records and staff readiness. Use it to prepare for inspections. For the compliance map use the Diagnostic Regulatory Compliance Guide.

Purpose of this tool & output

Be ready for any regulatory inspection

How the output is used

Use it to be ready for any regulatory inspection — one combined checklist of the licences, records and standards inspectors from different authorities check.

Who receives it

Inspections may be conducted by the clinical-establishment authority, the PC-PNDT Appropriate Authority, AERB and the SPCB, jointly or separately.

How to submit / file it

Keep the registrations, AERB and PC-PNDT records, BMW and quality documents in order; produce them on the inspection visit and reply to any observation in writing within the given time.

Fees & charges

No fee for the inspection; non-compliance can lead to penalties, suspension or sealing depending on the authority.

Who should vet it

A diagnostics-compliance consultant, to run a mock multi-authority audit of your records before inspectors arrive.

Important cautions

Different authorities inspect different things; keep each set of licences, displays and records current and produce-able. PC-PNDT and AERB findings are especially serious. This is a preparation aid, not legal representation.
