

Pathologist / Radiologist Employment Agreement

Diagnostics, Labs & Imaging

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This guide explains what the tool produces, how to use the output, and what to watch for. The actual output (draft/report) is generated on the tool page.

Background

Drafts an employment or engagement agreement for a pathologist or radiologist signatory, from your discrete terms. Use it to engage your signatory properly. For who-can-sign rules use the Signatory & Qualification Guide.

Purpose of this tool & output

Draft a contract for your signatory

How the output is used

Use the draft for a pathologist or radiologist employment or engagement — role, signatory duties, fees, notice and non-compete — reviewed by a lawyer.

Who receives it

The agreement is between the centre and the pathologist/radiologist; each keeps a signed copy.

Fees & charges

Usually executed on stamp paper per your state; the signatory and fee terms are the key commercial content.

Who should vet it

An employment lawyer, to make the signatory duties, fees and non-compete fair and enforceable.

Important cautions

This is a draft using your inputs, not legal advice. The signatory must genuinely supervise and be responsible for reports — name-lending is illegal. Broad post-employment non-competes are generally unenforceable in India. Have a lawyer review it before signing.
