

PC-PNDT Registration & Compliance

Diagnostics, Labs & Imaging

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This guide explains what the tool produces, how to use the output, and what to watch for. The actual output (draft/report) is generated on the tool page.

Background

Explains PC-PNDT registration and ongoing compliance for ultrasound or any imaging that can detect fetal sex — registration, Form F, machine and record rules and the strict prohibitions. Use it to stay compliant. For the ongoing check use the PC-PNDT Compliance Audit.

Purpose of this tool & output

Register ultrasound / imaging under PC-PNDT

How the output is used

Use it to register ultrasound or imaging under PC-PNDT — the registration, Form-F record-keeping and strict rules against sex determination.

Who receives it

The registration goes to the Appropriate Authority under the PC-PNDT Act (District/State health administration).

How to submit / file it

Apply to the Appropriate Authority with the machine, qualified sonologist and premises details, obtain the certificate before use, and maintain Form-F records for every scan.

Fees & charges

A state-set PC-PNDT registration fee; the registration is renewed and requires strict ongoing record compliance.

Who should vet it

The PC-PNDT Appropriate Authority, which verifies the qualified sonologist and machine and inspects records; a qualified radiologist/sonologist must operate.

Important cautions

Sex determination or communicating fetal sex is a criminal offence under the PC-PNDT Act with severe penalties including cancellation and prosecution. Form F must be filled accurately for every pregnancy scan. PC-PNDT is administered by the District Appropriate Authority — confirm exact requirements locally.
