

Reagent-Rental vs Purchase Analyzer

Diagnostics, Labs & Imaging

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This guide explains what the tool produces, how to use the output, and what to watch for. The actual output (draft/report) is generated on the tool page.

Background

Compares reagent-rental (equipment placed free against a reagent commitment) versus outright analyser purchase — on cash, cost per test, lock-in and flexibility — and recommends the fit. Use it to decide the equipment model. For ROI use the Equipment ROI / Payback Analyzer.

Purpose of this tool & output

Rent-with-reagents or buy analysers outright

How the output is used

Use it to decide rent-with-reagents or buy analysers outright — the volume, cash and cost-per-test trade-off with a clear recommendation.

Who should vet it

Your CA or a finance-savvy lab owner, to confirm the volume and cost-per-test assumptions behind the rent-versus-buy call.

Important cautions

Reagent-rental avoids upfront capital but usually costs more per test and locks you into a minimum purchase for years; buying is cheaper per test at high volume but needs capital and carries obsolescence risk. Verify minimum-commitment and exit clauses, and compute with your real volume.
