Get NABET, NABL tie-ups and empanelments

How the output is used

Use it to get NABET, NABL tie-ups and empanelments — the accreditation and empanelment a firm needs to take on EIA, monitoring and government work.

Who receives it

Accreditation is granted by QCI-NABET (for EIA consultants) and NABL (for testing labs); empanelments are with SPCBs, ministries and PSUs.

How to submit / file it

Apply to NABET/NABL with the team qualifications, quality system and past experience, undergo assessment, and separately register on the empanelment portals of the relevant authorities.

Fees & charges

NABET/NABL application and assessment fees plus the cost of building the quality system and qualified team; accreditation is periodically renewed.

Who should vet it

The NABET/NABL assessors who audit the firm capability, usually with an accreditation consultant preparing the firm.

Important cautions
