

CRZ / CAA Compliance Audit

Background

Audits a coastal or brackish aquaculture operation against CRZ and Coastal Aquaculture Authority rules — registration, siting, effluent and records — flagging gaps before an inspection. Use it to avoid demolition and penalties.

Purpose of this tool & output

Audit a coastal farm for compliance

How the output is used

Use it to audit a coastal farm for compliance — a CRZ and CAA compliance audit that finds setback, zone and effluent gaps before an inspection.

Who should vet it

A CRZ/aquaculture consultant, to validate the compliance findings and corrective actions before an inspection.

Important cautions

A structured self-audit from your inputs; actual CRZ classification and CAA status need authorised verification and rules are enforced strictly. Confirm your position with the Coastal Aquaculture Authority and State Coastal Zone Management Authority and act on notices promptly.
