

Export Incentive Claim Pack (RoDTEP / Drawback / EPCG / Advance Authorisation)

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This guide explains what the tool produces, how to use the output, and what to watch for. The actual output (draft/report) is generated on the tool page.

Background

Prepares an export-incentive or duty-benefit claim — RoDTEP, Duty Drawback, an EPCG authorisation, or Advance Authorisation — mapping the export product to the applicable rate or scheme, computing the indicative benefit, and assembling the shipping, banking and DGFT/customs documents for the claim.

Purpose of this tool & output

Prepare an export-incentive claim — RoDTEP, Duty Drawback, EPCG or Advance Authorisation — with the eligibility, rate mapping and document set

How the output is used

Use the mapped scheme, the rate and the computed benefit to file the RoDTEP/Drawback claim in the shipping bill and ICEGATE ledger, or the EPCG/Advance Authorisation application on the DGFT portal, with the document set assembled.

Who receives it

DGFT (Directorate General of Foreign Trade) for EPCG and Advance Authorisation; Customs/ICEGATE for RoDTEP and Duty Drawback credit.

How to submit / file it

For RoDTEP/Drawback, claim in the shipping bill at export and reconcile the scrip/credit on ICEGATE; for EPCG/Advance Authorisation, apply on the DGFT portal with the IEC, the export-obligation projection and the supporting documents.

Who should vet it

A customs/DGFT consultant or a chartered accountant — to confirm the correct scheme, the RITC/rate mapping, and the export-obligation and value computation.

Important cautions

The schemes are mutually exclusive on the same benefit and each has its own rate schedule, export obligation and time limit; a wrong RITC or a missed shipping-bill declaration forfeits the benefit. Verify the current rate and scheme conditions with a DGFT consultant before claiming.
