

Fire NOC / Fire-Safety Certificate Application

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This guide explains what the tool produces, how to use the output, and what to watch for. The actual output (draft/report) is generated on the tool page.

Background

Prepares a fire NOC or fire-safety certificate application for a building — a residential high-rise, commercial, industrial, hospital, school or assembly building — mapping the National Building Code and state fire-safety requirements to the building, assembling the drawings and equipment/compliance documents, and preparing the application for the fire service, so occupancy is not held up.

Purpose of this tool & output

Prepare a fire NOC / fire-safety certificate application for a building, with the fire-safety requirements mapped and the drawing/document set

How the output is used

Use the mapped National Building Code / state fire-safety requirements, the drawings and the equipment/compliance documents to apply for the fire NOC or fire-safety certificate for the building, and to clear occupancy.

Who receives it

The State Fire Service / the Chief Fire Officer / the Directorate of Fire Services that issues the fire NOC or fire-safety certificate.

How to submit / file it

Apply on the state fire-service portal with the building plan and fire-safety drawings, the fire-fighting/detection equipment details and the compliance documents; the NOC issues after the drawing scrutiny and a site inspection.

Fees & charges

The application/scrutiny fee depends on the building type, height and area per the state fire-service schedule; a consultant/fire-engineer fee for the drawings and compliance.

Who should vet it

A licensed fire-safety consultant / fire engineer — to map the NBC and state requirements to the building, prepare the drawings, and get the inspection cleared.

Important cautions

A fire NOC is tied to the building occupancy class, height and area, and occupying a high-rise/assembly building without a valid fire NOC/certificate is illegal and unsafe; the requirement and renewal cycle vary by state. Verify the current state fire-service requirement.
