

Land-Record Correction Application

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This guide explains what the tool produces, how to use the output, and what to watch for. The actual output (draft/report) is generated on the tool page.

Background

Prepares an application to correct an error in the land record — a wrong name spelling, an area or extent mismatch, a khata error, or a survey-number discrepancy — with the evidence that proves the correct position and the representation to the revenue authority, so the record matches reality before it causes a transaction to fail.

Purpose of this tool & output

Fix an error in the land record — name, area, khata or survey-number — with the correction application and evidence

How the output is used

Use the correction application and the proof of the correct position to file with the revenue authority to fix a name, area, khata or survey-number error, and follow up until the record matches reality.

Who receives it

The revenue authority (Tehsildar/Patwari/Circle Officer or the land-records/survey office) that maintains and corrects the RoR/khata/survey record.

How to submit / file it

Apply to the revenue/land-records office with the existing record, the document proving the correct position (deed, order, survey) and the identity; the correction is made after verification and any notice.

Who should vet it

A local revenue/property consultant or, for a disputed correction, a lawyer — to confirm the evidence and follow the application through.

Important cautions

A correction backed by an inconsistent document invites a dispute and may need a civil/revenue proceeding rather than a counter correction; a genuine clerical error is faster. Fix the record before it causes a transaction to fail.
