

PMAY Housing Application (Gramin / Urban / CLSS)

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This guide explains what the tool produces, how to use the output, and what to watch for. The actual output (draft/report) is generated on the tool page.

Background

Prepares a Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana application — Gramin or Urban, including the credit-linked subsidy (CLSS) where applicable — checking the income-category eligibility, computing the indicative subsidy, and preparing the document set and the geo-tag and instalment follow-up.

Purpose of this tool & output

Prepare a PMAY housing application — Gramin or Urban, or the CLSS loan subsidy — with eligibility, subsidy computation and geo-tag follow-up

How the output is used

Use the eligibility, the vertical determination and the indicative subsidy to file the PMAY application (Gramin, Urban or CLSS), assemble the documents, and follow up the geo-tagging and instalment release.

Who receives it

The Urban Local Body or Gram Panchayat and the SLNA for PMAY, or the lending bank for the CLSS subsidy claim (via the nodal agency).

How to submit / file it

Apply under the correct vertical with the income-category, first-house and preferably woman-ownership proof and the land or loan documents; for CLSS the bank claims the subsidy on the eligible loan.

Fees & charges

No application fee; the beneficiary contribution and, for CLSS, the loan cost are separate.

Who should vet it

No professional is needed for Gramin or Urban; for CLSS the bank confirms the subsidy eligibility and applies it to the loan.

Important cautions

The vertical, the income category and the first-house and woman-ownership conditions decide eligibility and the subsidy, and the geo-tagging and instalment steps must be completed for release. Verify with the ULB or bank.
