

Protection / Safety Petition Support

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This guide explains what the tool produces, how to use the output, and what to watch for. The actual output (draft/report) is generated on the tool page.

Background

Drafts a protection or safety request — a police protection application or the material for a protection petition to the High Court — for a person facing a genuine threat to life or safety, harassment, or a couple or witness at risk, with the facts, the threat basis and the specific protection sought.

Purpose of this tool & output

Draft a protection or safety request — to the police or the court — for a threat to life, harassment, or a couple or witness at risk

How the output is used

Use the drafted protection request — the facts, the threat basis and the specific protection sought — to make a police protection application, or as the material for a protection petition your advocate files in the High Court.

Who receives it

The Superintendent of Police / the local police for a protection application, or the High Court (through your advocate) for a protection petition.

How to submit / file it

Submit the application to the SP/police with the threat evidence and the protection sought; for a court petition, file through an advocate in the High Court with the affidavit and the material.

Who should vet it

A criminal/constitutional lawyer — a High Court protection petition must be settled and argued by an advocate; even a police application benefits from legal framing.

Important cautions

A protection order needs a genuine, demonstrable threat — a vague or manufactured apprehension is dismissed and can backfire; a couple/witness-at-risk matter is time-sensitive. Get a lawyer to file the court petition.
