

Social-Security Pension Application (Old-age / Widow / Disability)

This guide explains what the tool produces, how to use the output, and what to watch for. The actual output (draft/report) is generated on the tool page.

Background

Prepares a social-security pension application — old-age (NSAP or state), widow, or disability pension — assembling the age, income and status proof, the bank and Aadhaar seeding and the follow-up, so an eligible applicant gets the pension without paying a local agent.

Purpose of this tool & output

Prepare a social-security pension application — old-age, widow or disability — with full document assembly and follow-up

How the output is used

Use the scheme match, the document checklist and the application content to file the old-age, widow or disability pension with the local body, complete the bank and Aadhaar seeding, and follow up to sanction.

Who receives it

The sanctioning authority — the Gram Panchayat or Block, or the ULB, and the social-welfare department; the pension is credited to the Aadhaar-seeded bank account.

How to submit / file it

Apply with the age, income or BPL and status proof (a death certificate for a widow, a disability certificate for disability) and the bank and Aadhaar details, to the local body, and follow up for sanction.

Fees & charges

No government fee; only the cost of the supporting certificates.

Who should vet it

No professional is needed; the certificates come from the tehsil or SDM and the local body verifies eligibility.

Important cautions

The scheme and amount differ by state and category and the Aadhaar-bank seeding is essential for the credit; a missing status or income proof stalls the sanction. Verify with the local body.
