Legal

Background

Draft a firm, professional demand letter under Indian law — establishing your legal standing, stating the facts, making a specific demand with a deadline and warning of legal action — with the relevant statutory references (MSME Act, Consumer Protection Act, Contract Act). Enter the dispute and demand below.

Purpose of this tool & output

How the output is used

Use the draft to formally demand payment or performance before escalating — a firm, professional demand letter that sets a deadline.

Who receives it

The letter is addressed to the defaulting party (and, where relevant, copied to their counsel); keep proof of dispatch.
