Background

Purpose of this tool & output

Draft a civil-suit or arbitration statement of claim

How the output is used

Use the draft to start a civil or arbitration action — a statement of claim setting out facts, cause of action and relief sought.

Who receives it

It is filed before the court or arbitral tribunal and served on the opposing party.

How to submit / file it

File with the cause-title, verified pleadings and supporting documents per the court/tribunal rules; a lawyer settles and files it.

Who should vet it

A litigation lawyer, to settle the pleadings, cause of action and relief before filing.

Important cautions

AI-generated draft; an advocate must finalise and file with correct court fees.
