Purpose of this tool & output

Draft a defence to a claim or plaint

How the output is used

Use the draft to defend a claim — a written statement or reply that answers the plaint and raises your defences on time.

Who receives it

It is filed before the court hearing the suit and served on the plaintiff/claimant.

How to submit / file it

File within the limitation period with para-wise reply, defences and any counter-claim per the court rules; a lawyer settles and files it.

Who should vet it

A litigation lawyer, to settle the defences and any counter-claim before filing within the deadline.

Important cautions

AI-generated draft; an advocate must finalise within the court timeline.
