Logistics & Trade

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This guide explains what the tool produces, how to use the output, and what to watch for. The actual output (draft/report) is generated on the tool page.

Background

Determines whether your product needs BIS certification (ISI mark under Scheme I or CRS registration) to be imported or sold in India, and lays out the testing, application and grant process, timeline and consequences. Use it before importing regulated electronics, toys, steel and similar goods.

Purpose of this tool & output

Meet mandatory Indian standards for imports

How the output is used

Use the guide to meet mandatory Indian standards (BIS) for imports that fall under the compulsory certification scheme.

Who receives it

The Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS).

How to submit / file it

Apply under the applicable scheme (ISI/CRS/FMCS) with product tests at a recognised lab; a licence/registration is issued on conformity.

Fees & charges

Application, testing and marking fees per the scheme.

Who should vet it

A BIS/product-certification consultant, for the scheme and testing.
