Background

Explains retail drug licence requirements — the application, registered pharmacist, premises and storage, inspection, grant and renewal — with the documents (pharmacist registration, premises proof) and conditions (storage, records, pharmacist presence). Use this to get your retail drug licence. Confirm forms and requirements with your state FDA.

Purpose of this tool & output

Get your retail drug licence

How the output is used

Use it to prepare your retail drug licence application — the registered pharmacist, premises and documents — before you apply to the State Drug Controller.

Who receives it

The State Drug Controller / State Licensing Authority under the Drugs and Cosmetics Act.

How to submit / file it

Apply online on the state FDA portal with premises proof, the registered pharmacist details and cold-storage and area proof; an inspection follows before grant.

Fees & charges

A modest government fee per licence, differing for retail and wholesale and varying by state.

Who should vet it

A registered pharmacist (mandatory) and, if needed, a drug-licence consultant.
