Background

Draft an artwork and design IP agreement between a printer/design studio and a client — ownership or licence of created designs and dielines, usage rights, and warranties on supplied content — to avoid ownership disputes. Fill in the terms below.

Purpose of this tool & output

Settle who owns the design

How the output is used

Use the draft to settle who owns the design — an artwork and design IP agreement across ownership, licence and reuse — reviewed by a lawyer.

Who receives it

The agreement is between the print unit/designer and the client; each keeps a signed copy.

Fees & charges

Usually on nominal stamp paper; the ownership/assignment, licence and reuse terms are the key content.

Who should vet it

An IP lawyer, to make the ownership/assignment and reuse clauses clear so there is no later dispute.

Important cautions

AI-generated draft; have an IP lawyer review before signing.
