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This guide explains what the tool produces, how to use the output, and what to watch for. The actual output (draft/report) is generated on the tool page.

Background

Produces a cold-chain setup and monitoring plan — refrigeration selection, temperature monitoring and logging, backup power, and handling of vaccines/insulin/biologicals. Use it to store refrigerated drugs compliantly. For cold-chain regulatory rules use the Cold Chain Compliance tool (P6).

Purpose of this tool & output

Store vaccines and insulin safely

How the output is used

Use it to store vaccines and insulin safely — a cold chain and refrigerated-drug setup that holds temperature reliably.

Important cautions

Cold-chain drugs (insulin, vaccines, biologicals) are destroyed by heat OR freezing — use a dedicated monitored fridge at the required range (typically 2-8C), log temperatures, and back up power against outages. Never sell stock exposed to a cold-chain break. Confirm each drug specific storage requirement and cold-chain norms.
