

Registered Pharmacist Employment Agreement

Pharmacy & Chemist Retail

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This guide explains what the tool produces, how to use the output, and what to watch for. The actual output (draft/report) is generated on the tool page.

Background

Drafts an employment agreement for a registered pharmacist with discrete terms — role, registration, presence/hours, salary, responsibilities and termination. Use it to employ your pharmacist genuinely (not name-lending). Fill each term separately.

Purpose of this tool & output

Employ a registered pharmacist properly

How the output is used

Use the draft to employ a registered pharmacist properly — role, registration duty, hours, pay and confidentiality — reviewed by a lawyer.

Who receives it

The agreement is between the pharmacy and the registered pharmacist; each keeps a signed copy.

Fees & charges

Usually on nominal stamp paper; the presence-during-hours duty, pay and notice terms are the key content.

Who should vet it

An employment lawyer, to keep the registration-duty, notice and confidentiality clauses compliant and enforceable.

Important cautions

Template for guidance, not legal advice. The pharmacist must genuinely be employed and present during operating hours — a name-lending arrangement (registration used while the pharmacist is absent) is illegal and a common cause of licence cancellation and prosecution. Keep the registration current. Have a lawyer review; comply with labour law.
