Who receives it

The Department of Telecommunications (DoT), which grants the Unified Licence and its service authorisations.

How to submit / file it

Apply on Saral Sanchar for the UL and the specific service authorisations you need (Access, ISP, NLD, ILD and others), with the prescribed documents, entry fees and bank guarantees.

Fees & charges

Authorisation-wise entry fees and bank guarantees set by DoT, plus an annual licence fee levied on Adjusted Gross Revenue (AGR).

Who should vet it

A telecom licensing consultant familiar with current DoT Unified Licence norms.
