Background

Explains data-privacy obligations (DPDP Act) for a travel business handling passports, visas, cards and personal data — consent, purpose limitation, storage/security, sharing with suppliers/visa centres, and breach handling — so you handle sensitive traveller data lawfully. Use it to set data practices. For the compliance map use the Tour Operator Licensing & Compliance Overview.

Purpose of this tool & output

Handle traveller data lawfully

How the output is used

Use it to handle traveller data lawfully — a data privacy (DPDP) plan for travel across consent, storage, sharing and retention.

Who receives it

The plan governs how traveller data (passport, payment, itinerary) is handled, and is shared with travellers whose data it covers.

Important cautions

DPDP compliance is evolving; secure passport/card data and take consent. Confirm current obligations with a consultant.
